

Strengthening capacity for transdisciplinary water-climate research

A hybrid, interactive, transdisciplinary summer school aimed to strengthen capacity to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG6) – "Ensure access to water and sanitation for all", and SDG13 – Climate Action. The programme includes interactive lectures, engagement of the participants in a theatre performance for outreach to local communities, practical sessions, fieldwork/excursions, a science slam competition, poster session, three-minute thesis competition, and an award ceremony.

Topics: (1) Ethics and intersectionality for water-climate studies, (2) Integrated water resources management, (3) Groundwater and climate adaptation, (4) Water-climate monitoring tools, (5) Water-Energy-Food nexus, (6) Research Proposal Writing, (6) Thesis write-up & Writing for publication, (7) Theatre for Development: Raising awareness on SDG6 & 13.

Learning Activities: (1) Interactive Lectures, (2) Fieldwork, (3) Theatre development and performance, (3) Science Slam competition, (4) Poster Session, (5) Three-minute thesis competition.
